**Weatherization - \$57,858,000\***

- Initial application submitted 3/23/09
- Comprehensive application due 5/12/09
- Public hearing required, Oklahoma City - 4/10/09

Criteria anticipated for allocation to CAAs

- 25% Percentage of county population at 200% poverty and below compared to state
- 25% Number of housing units in county compared to state
- 25% Percentage of substandard housing in county
  - Unfinished plumbing, unfinished kitchen, overcrowding
- 15% Unemployment rate
- 10% Total area of county

Eligible criteria

- 200% of poverty and below
- Energy audit determines that installation of measures yields a savings to investment ratio greater than one
