Oklahoma Manufacturing Reboot Program

The Oklahoma Manufacturing Reboot Program was created to address the negative effect the COVID-19 pandemic has had on Oklahoma businesses, specifically manufacturers. This program utilizes up to \$5 million from the Governor's Quick Action Closing Fund to assist existing Oklahoma manufacturers as they retool to develop new products and/or expand current capabilities.

Who can apply?

Oklahoma manufacturing companies that meet the specified NAICS code requirements (NAICS codes 311111-339999)

All manufacturing NAICS are eligible, however examples include manufacturers of:

- Medical device equipment
- Personal protective equipment
- Hygiene products, disinfecting equipment, and filtering equipment
- Water treatment equipment
- Food and pharmaceuticals
- Supporting critical industries identified by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security including telecommunications, chemicals, transportation equipment, etc.

Priority will be given to companies producing products for the healthcare industry such as medical devices, personal protection equipment or pharmaceuticals; other projects will be eligible.

How much money will be awarded per company?

Awards will range from \$25,000 to \$150,000, depending on market potential and long-term economic impact of the new production capabilities in Oklahoma's economy.

What can the funds be used for?

- Purchase of machinery
- Purchase of CAD/CAM equipment or software
- Payroll
- Training for new and/or existing employees in partnership with Oklahoma CareerTech
- Training for new and/or existing employees

How to apply:

Submit an application through the Oklahoma Department of Commerce with short description of how the award will address any of the following for the company:

- productivity
- diversification of products
- diversification of capabilities

Consideration will also be given for awards associated with projects that can be implemented quickly.

What happens after my company receives the funds?

Participating businesses will be required to provide quarterly reports verifying employment levels and expenditures.
